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P R E F A C E.

The presentation of the Survey Report on the **Socio-Economic and Educational Conditions of Minorities in Karnataka**, is like a dream coming true. Having been working in the Socio-Economic and Educational field from Past 25 years, I was feeling that in order to remove the **Socio-Economic and Educational Backwardness of the society**, proper data is absolutely essential. In the absence of proper data, Scientific Planning for comprehensive advancement in various directions is not possible. When I was asked to take up the responsibility of the Chairmanship of the Karnataka State Minorities Commission by **Sri M.Veerappa Moily, the then Chief Minister**, I requested him that one of the terms of reference to the Commission should be to conduct a house to house survey of the Socio-Economic and Educational conditions of Minorities in Karnataka. I am grateful to **Sri M.Veerappa Moily**, who appreciated the concept and included it as one of the terms of reference to the Commission.

My colleagues in the Commission, the Commission Staff, got fascinated and took the survey as a big challenge. Though the Commission as such was not having adequate infrastructure to take up such a massive work, the staff of the Commission under the dynamic leadership of **Sri. S.N.H.Razvi, Secretary of the Commission** and **Sri K.Firoze Ahmed, Joint Director**,

accepted this challenge and gave me full support in taking up this work. I must acknowledge here that the entire Government machinery gave full support for this survey work. Particularly I am grateful to the **Director of Economics & Statistics, Sri. V. Shanthappa, Deputy Commissioners of all districts, District Statistical Officers, District Officers for Backward Classes & Minorities, Commissioners of Corporations, and other officials who fully involved themselves in the survey work.** The Minorities voluntary Social Organisations have extended full support in giving publicity to the survey through out the State and Organisations like the **Board of Wakfs, Christian Associations and even the Churches, the Mosques, the Jain Mandalis, the Gurudwaras etc.,** extended all assistance to our field staff during the survey.

Immediately after the field survey was completed, I had to relinquish the Office of the Chairman of the Commission before my election as member of Rajya Sabha. **But this did not affect the work of computerisation and processing of data.** I was extending my full support to the staff of the Commission in terms of guidance, supervision, sorting out the problems as and when they arose.

The task that followed the field survey was more difficult than the field survey itself. The task included collecting the schedules, verification of the

schedules and keying in the data to the Computers and recording it for historical purpose. It was a stupendous task and at one time it looked as if we may not be able to proceed further. Thanks to Almighty and the commitment to the task Sri Ishtiaq Ahmed, a Computer Software Engineer of repute, designed the software and took up the responsibility of overseeing the computerisation process and we engaged young entrepreneurs who with the help of 150 Computers worked 24 hours every day for keying in the data. In the meantime the Government felt that to complete this task a separate High Power Committee will have to be constituted. This Committee was constituted and I was asked to take up the Chairmanship of the High Power committee with Sri D.J. Balraj, IAS (Rtd), Sri Surendranath IAS (Rtd), Sri K. Nazeer Hussain, Rtd Director of Plan Monitoring, Sri Syed Yaseen, the then Chairman of Karnataka State Minorities Development Corporation, Sri S.N.H. Razvi, Secretary, Minorities commission as members and Sri K. Firoze Ahmed, Jt. Director as Member Secretary. This High Power committee met several times, studied the data collected and submitted an interim report to the Government on 18.8.1994. I am happy to state that most of the recommendations of the High Power Committee, which are given as annexure to this report, were accepted by the Government.

Again on the change of Government in the State, when all non-official Chairmen of various committees, submitted their resignation, I also submitted resignation to the Hon'ble Chief Minister Sri H.D. Deve Gowda. He asked me to continue and complete the work. I am grateful to him, for having enabled me to complete this task.

I am specially grateful to Sri C.K. Jaffer Sharief, Union Minister for Railways, who supported this cause in all respects. He has not only been a source of inspiration and motivation to us but extended full support for the successful conduct of survey. He has always advocated that proper data for any planning is very essential, particularly for the Socio, Economic and Educational upliftment of Minorities. He has done similar survey in 1973 in Devarjeevanhally area in Bangalore District.

If I look back I find that what was looking impossible God has made it possible and Karnataka has the honour of conducting such a massive survey of minorities in the State. The Survey is first of its kind in the Country. I am happy that Karnataka State has taken this honour. Karnataka has always tried to provide Social Justice, Economic benefits and Educational facilities to all section of its population particularly to Minorities. Various tables that we have

generated and the data available with the Commission on every aspect of the Socio-Economic and Educational sphere of the Religious Minorities will be very useful in ensuring their planned and systematic Socio-Economic and Educational upliftment. The Survey tables and other data available will be of great help to voluntary organisations, Educational Institutions and other Social organisations to take up various welfare measures.

Minorities or Ethnic races / population is a universal phenomenon. They are there in almost every society and in every country. They have special problems. It is the duty of the **Society and the State** to give due considerations to these problems and take measures to ensure that they do not suffer from a sense of deprivation. India has the largest population of minorities which is more than the total population of many European Countries. The minorities here therefore deserve very special care for rendering Social Justice to them.

Our Constitution recognises the Minorities, both religious and Linguistic and has made provisions to safeguard their Educational rights, cultural rights and religious rights. Articles 15 & 16 are there to provide social justice by recognising Economic and Educational backwardness of certain classes of the Society. Religious groups are part of the Society and their Backwardness both Economic, Educational and Social are

to be identified and effective measures are to be taken to improve their lot. Hence the Government has included certain groups of Minorities in the list of Backward Classes. Sometimes the Minorities suffer from individual discrimination also, though not from the Government. This also very often creates problems. Sometimes the backwardness of the minorities may be due to certain psychological factors within the minorities themselves, who instead of taking advantage of the various welfare measures of the Government develop a feeling that they will not get any justice, and never try to take their due share in the resources of the society. Sometimes such feelings may be only illusory. Minorities do have a feeling that they are not getting their due share in the various economic and social programmes of the Government, jobs and Educational Programmes. Such a feeling among Minorities or Ethnic races is common and should be taken in right spirit and understanding. The Religious Minorities who have remained backward should be treated as a class of Society and not as a religious group. No Government can ignore the need to look into the backwardness of a section of the Society, just because they belong to a particular religious group. I am confident that this report will help Karnataka Government to take note of the areas of Economic, Educational and Social backwardness of the Minorities and take necessary corrective measures to remove them.

I am also confident that the Government of Karnataka will benefit from this survey in providing social justice to minorities. The Report of the survey should be updated by the Minorities commission at regular intervals as it has acquired a Statutory status now.

I thank all those who have helped me in completing this task, particularly members of the Minorities Commission who were with me, members of High Power Committee, Secretary, Joint Director, Under Secretary and other Staff of the Minorities Commission, the Chairman of the Minorities Commission, who succeeded me Sri. Sadath Ali Khan and the present Chairman Dr. Abdul Kareem, Government officials and all organisations and individuals for their support and co-operation. I am especially grateful to Sri.K. Nazeer Hussain, Rtd. Director, Plan Monitoring for assisting me in preparation of the Report.

**SOCIO-ECONOMIC & EDUCATIONAL SURVEY OF RELIGIOUS
MINORITIES IN KARNATAKA.**

I. INTRODUCTION :

a) Religious Minorities constitute 15% of the population of the State of Karnataka. They are Muslims, Christians, Jains, Sikhs, Buddhists and Parsees. They have been living in complete harmony with the majority community all along. Over centuries they have been very well integrated in the Socio-Economic fabric of the State. History records that significant contribution has been made by them towards economic development of the State. Culturally also the Statue of Gomteshwara at Shravanabelgola, Bandenawaz Dargah at Gulbarga, Golgumbaz at Bijapur and St. Mary's Basilica at Shivajinagar are standing tributes to the glorious heritage of Karnataka. The Co-existence of Sri. Ranganatha Temple and Tippu's Mosque in its vicinity at Srirangapatna, which are equally revered by both the communities, demonstrates the spirit of tolerance, mutual respect and brotherhood which has been the very essence of Karnataka's Culture.

When free India adopted its own Constitution, it was recognised that the political setup envisages majority rule and therefore some safeguards to minorities were considered essential. It is in this context that articles 29 and 30 held out certain constitutional guarantees for the protection and promotion of the educational rights of the minorities. Therefore it became necessary to make some institutional arrangement to safeguard their implementation.

When planning for development became an accepted strategy for growth, the State started taking rapid strides in the

Socio-Economic and Educational spheres. This growth process also made it necessary to create an institution to ensure that a fair share of benefits of growth is delivered to these sections. The institutional arrangements made towards meeting these needs are described below.

Karnataka is one of the first few States in the Union to establish the State Minorities Commission to ensure that constitutional safeguards provided to Minorities are extended to them in full measure and to make recommendations towards their socio-economic growth and educational advancement. Karnataka is also one of the pioneering States to make institutional arrangement to enable the Minorities to avail financial help for economic growth by establishing the Karnataka Minorities Development Corporation. The experience of the functioning of these two institutions over a period of time, brought out the fact that absence of data, pertaining to socio-economic and Educational Conditions of these sections, was a major handicap towards appropriate planning and effective delivery of benefits accruing from the plans to them. Particularly in the context of increasing demands being made by these communities to extend to them assistance in Welfare measures, establishment of Educational and other Institutions, adequate representation in services etc., it has become imperative to collect data about these sections of society in a systematic manner. Keeping these facts in view the Government re-constituted the Commission on 6-2-1993 under the Chairmanship of **Sri.K.Rahman Khan**. The other members were Shri. Surendra Kumār Heggade, Fr.F.P.S. Moniz, Shri. S.K.S.J.Jahagirdar,

Sri. William Richards, Shri. M. J. Victor and Smt. Octavia Albuquerque.

One of the terms of reference given to the re-constituted Commission was the conduct of a Socio-Economic and Educational Survey of religious Minorities in Karnataka. Pursuant to these developments, the State Minorities Commission initiated action to conduct the Survey and conducted it successfully.

B). **OBJECTIVES :**

THE OBJECTIVES OF THE SURVEY WERE AS UNDER :-

1. To ascertain the Socio-Economic and Educational Status of Minorities.
2. To ascertain the School drop-out rate of Minorities in the age group 5 to 14 years.
3. To assess the extent of awareness of welfare programmes among Minority groups and to measure the actual quantum of benefits which accrued to them.
4. To take stock of and to make a factual assessment of the civic amenities in the localities with minority concentration in villages and in urban areas.
5. To assess employment levels obtaining among the Minorities.

c). **PREPARATORY WORK, DESIGN AND COVERAGE:-**

A Task Force of experts under the Chairmanship of the Chairman, State Minorities Commission was Constituted to design the Schedules and also to work-out the modalities of the Survey. The Director, Economics & Statistics was also consulted in this behalf. In the light of recommendations made and consultations held, the Commission approved the schedules and modalities of the conduct of the Survey. A detailed estimate of cost of the Survey and other assistance required by the Commission from the Government was forwarded to the Government for their approval. The

Government in their Order No. DPAR:32:L&RM-93, Dated 15-07-1993 sanctioned the conduct of Socio-Economic & Educational Survey of Minorities, approved the cost estimate, and also issued orders to the various departments to participate in the conduct of the Survey.

The Survey design so approved contemplated enumeration of all the households belonging to religious Minority denominations namely the Muslims, the Christians, the Sikhs, the Jains, the Parsees and the Buddhists living in Karnataka. This was a gigantic and difficult Survey. Gigantic in the sense that it was a Survey which was a defacto Census since every family of these religious denominations was to be enumerated. In addition to this, the information on infrastructural facilities and civic amenities available in the Minority Concentration Villages and Urban localities was also to be collected. It was difficult particularly because it was a difficult task to identify the families of Micro minorities like Buddhists, Parsees and Sikhs in the state during the course of enumeration.

D). THE SURVEY-ITS ORGANISATION AND OPERATION:

The Survey was launched by the then Chief Minister of Karnataka, Sri. M.Veerappa Moily on 16-2-1994 and the first household enumerated was that of the first Citizen of the State namely Shri Khursheed Alam Khan, His Excellency the Governor of Karnataka. The enumeration concluded on 31-3-1994.

The overall operations at the State level were under the direct charge of the State Minorities Commission. Sri K.Firoze Ahmed, Joint Director of Karnataka State Minorities

Commission co-ordinated the conduct of the Survey. At the district level the Deputy Commissioners of the Districts were designated as District Survey Commissioners and were entrusted with overall responsibility for the conduct of the Survey at district level. The District officers for Backward Classes and Minorities were designated as Additional Survey Commissioners to coordinate the Survey work at district level. The District Statistical Officers of each district were entrusted with technical responsibilities of forming blocks, imparting training, supervising field work and scrutinising at random the filled in schedules. At the Taluk level, the Tahsildars were the Taluk level Survey Officers. The Commissioners of City Corporations were made the Corporation Survey Commissioners. The Commissioners of City Municipal Councils, the Chief Officers of Town Municipalities, Notified Areas and Sanitary Boards were appointed as Survey Officers for their respective jurisdictions. In view of the gigantic magnitude and complex nature of the task, it was felt necessary to associate the voluntary organisations of minorities in a big way with the government machinery in the conduct of the Survey. Accordingly the Wakf Board and its machinery at district and taluk levels, the mutavallies of Mosques, the Churches, the Jain temples, the Buddhists pagodas, along with a number of organisations of minorities were involved in the enumeration work. This voluntary assistance was of great help in the effective conduct of the Survey and the same is acknowledged with a deep sense of appreciation and gratitude. Training programmes were organised at State, District and Taluk levels. The massive operation of distribution of blank schedules and collection of duly filled in

schedules was organised in a meticulously planned manner. The magnitude of the operation can be assessed from the number of filledin schedules received as can be seen from the following table:-

E). HIGH POWER COMMITTEE:

Since the receipt of filled in schedules was massive, it became necessary to constitute a high power committee which could give direction for proper processing of data, preparation of reports and making recommendations towards planning for development of these sections entirely on the basis of the results of the Survey. This committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Sri K. Rahman Khan, M.P. under G.O No. DPAR:31:L&RM-94 dated 02-08-1994. The members of the Committee are :-

f). COMPUTERISATION & SOFTWARE, DATA ENTRY & TABULATION :

Inhouse software package was developed by the Commission to computerise and process the large number of filled in schedules received. Sri. Ishtiaq Ahmed, the Computer Specialist appointed by the Commission was in-charge of the entire Computerisation work including preparation of the software packages. Since, the data entry was a massive operation it had to be got done from various agencies. The number of tables which are generated to meet the immediate needs are 54 in number. In fact the computer memory has preserved much more data which can be retrieved as and when needed according to requirements.

a) Demographic Features :

2.1. Population and Households coverage by the Survey.

The number of households and the population enumerated was as under:-

It may be seen from the above table that the average family size of minority households was 5.72. As seen from the 1991 census the total population of the State was 448.17 lakhs, for 81.44 lakhs households enumerated, which shows that the average family size was 5.5. It may also be seen that the largest average size was seen in respect of Swethambar Jains (5.93) and the lowest was in respect of Parsees (4.23). The family size among other communities is Muslim (5.89), Buddhists (5.41), Digambar Jains (5.11), SC Converted Christians (5.02),

Sikhs (4.84) and Other Christians (4.84).

Although the Survey aimed at total coverage of all families, due to difficulties faced in identification of minority households the percentage of coverage could be only as under:-

It may be seen from the above table that the average family size of minority households was 5.73 as seen from the 1951 census the total population of the State was 448.17 lakhs for 81.44 lakhs households enumerated which shows that the average family size was 5.5. It may also be seen that the largest average size was seen in respect of Svechambar Jains (5.93) and the lowest was in respect of Parases (4.73). Family size among other communities is Muslim (4.89), Buddhists (5.81), Digambar Jains (7.33), SC Converted Christians (5.03).

Sex wise Population and Sex Ratio

The following table indicates the population classified according to sex and also the sex ratio as indicated by the population of females against a population of 1000 males. This ratio is one of the indicators of women's health. The following table indicates the community wise details.

As can be seen from the above Muslim and Jain communities as well as the Christians to a certain extent have been enumerated to over 80% or nearly 80%. The reason for steep-fall in Buddhist enumeration was the difficulty faced in identification, despite efforts. In respect of Sikhs the coverage is low probably due to leaving out floating population staying in hotels etc., from the purview of the survey (while in census it gets enumerated), or it may also be the difficulty in locating their houses during enumeration. As far as Parsees are concerned they have not been separately given in the religious tables made available for census 91. Infact they have been included under other religions and persuasion. So it is difficult to state about the extent of their coverage.

The analysis in this report is presented only for the households and population covered in the Survey. The Survey data analysed in various tables is as on March 1994.

2.2) Sex wise Population and Sex Ratio

The following table indicates the population classified according to sex and also the sex ratio as indicated by the population of females against a population of 1000 males. This ratio is one of the indicators of women's health. The following table indicates the community wise details.

The above table indicates that among minorities, there were 930 females per 1000 males whereas as per 91 census on the whole in Karnataka there were 961 females per 1000 males. Inter-se among minorities also the sex ratio was higher among Christians (both SC Converted & Other Christians).

The previous table 2.4 brings out certain interesting facts as under:-

UN-MARRIED:

The un-married people both males and females above 17 years of age were 24.49%. The highest percentage of unmarried was among Other Christians (30.88%) followed by SC Converted Christians (28.31%), Sikhs (27.79%), Parsees (26.88%), Swethambar Jains (23.14%), Muslims (23.74%), Buddhists (22.67%), Digambar Jains (20.91%)

DIVORCED/SEPERATED :

Overall Percentage of divorced/separated persons among the minority groups was 0.31%. Community wise break-up was as under; Digambar Jains 0.37%, Parsees 0.33%, followed by muslims 0.31% were above or equal to the overall average of all minorities. While SC Converted Christians 0.25%, Other Christians 0.29%, Sikhs 0.16%, Swethambar Jains 0.11% were below overall average.

WIDOWS:-

The percentage of widow population among minorities was 10.24%. The highest number of widows were in Digambar Jains 11.93% followed by Other Christians 11.23%, Muslims 10.17%, SC Converted Christians 9.02%, Buddhists 8.94%, Parsees 6.77%, Swethamber Jains 6.42%, Sikhs 5.99%.

Community wise incidence of urbanisation is noted in descending order as follows.

Swethambar Jains 86.57%, Sikhs 72.34%, Parsees 68.57%, SC Converted Christians 60.74%, Muslims 50.81%, Other Christians 43.62% and Buddhists 41.57% followed by Digambar Jains 23.89% were having the percentage of urban population noted against the respective communities. The Urban population in the state as per 1991 census is 30.91%.

It may be seen from the above table that the highest percentage of illiteracy among minorities is among Buddhists 48% (who are generally SC converts) and Muslims 47%. These are the only two communities which are ranking above the state average of 44% among all minorities.

(1) It may be seen from the above table that literates without formal education are highest among Muslims. This is possibly because the Muslim families give great importance to the learning of the Quran and religious education wherever even minimum economic needs are met. But however where extreme poverty is noticed illiteracy prevails.

(2) The other points that emerge from the above table are :

(a) Upto 4th standard Muslims are having the highest percentage followed by Other Christians, Digambar Jains, Swethambar Jains and then by other communities.

(b) Upto 7th standard Muslims share lower level of educational attainment with SC Converted Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists & Parsees. But beyond that a steep fall is noticed vis-a-vis educational attainment of other communities. Infact the average percentage of all minorities has gone down because of poor higher educational attainments of Muslims. Obviously the drop out rates among them increases with increasing level of education.

The following points emerge for the table 3.3a:-

- (i) Parsees (24.00 %), SC Christians (25.00 %), Sikhs (28%), Buddhists (32.00 %), Muslims (35.00 %) were below all minorities average of 36.42% in the age group of 6-10.
- (ii) In the age group of 11-13, the overall percentage of persons attending schools was 38.46 and SC Converted Christians (29.00) followed by Sikhs (32), Parsees (34), Muslims (36), Buddhists (38) were below the average percentage of all minorities.
- (iii) In the age group of 14-16 the overall percentage of persons attending schools was 26.28 and Parsees (22) and Muslims (24) and SC Converted Christians (25) were below the average percentage of all minorities.
- (iv) In the age group of 17-19 the overall percentage of persons attending Colleges was 30.28 and lowest was by Parsees (22) followed by Muslims (25.85) were below the average percentage of all Minorities.
- (v) In the age group of 20-24 the overall percentage of persons attending colleges was 5.86 and only Muslims were the lowest with percentage of 4.93 attendance and it was the only community below the average percentage of all minorities.
- (vi) Since Parsees and Sikhs are very small group of people some of whose children are non resident and Sikhs are covered in the survey to the extent of 45% of their population, information of their children attending the schools does not reflect the real position. Therefore

one fact which emerges glaringly is that in the matter of their children attending schools and Colleges Muslims are singled out as a community with rising drop out rates as levels of education increase.

The overall percentage of households of minorities having membership of co-operative societies was 8.10%. The communities above average percentage were Digambar Jains (35.92%) followed by Parsees (16.58), Other Christians (11.08) and Buddhists (9.99%). Below the overall minorities average were SC Converted Christians (6.01%), Muslims (6.40%), Swethambar Jains (7.41%) and Sikhs (7.81%).

IMPORTANT FINDINGS OF THE SURVEY

The survey covered 88% of the Muslims, 79% of Christians and 83% of Jains in the State. The coverage of other minorities like Sikhs, Parsees and Buddhists has been less than 50%. The total 1994 population of these three minority communities is estimated to be about 89,000 as against the total population of all minorities which is estimated at 69.12 lakhs. The coverage is 59.45 lakhs population which account for 86% of the total estimated population of minorities. In all 10,39,566 minority households accounting for a population of 59,44,610 have been covered in the survey. The average family size of all minorities is 5.72. Other Christians have the smallest family size of 4.84 and the Swethamber Jains have the biggest which is 5.93. The average family size of muslims is 5.89.

The sex-ratio among minorities is 930 females per thousand males (Compared to 961 females per thousand males in the general population of the state as per 1991 census). Among minorities Other Christians have the highest sex ratio of 973 females per thousand males.

Other Christians have the highest number of un-married males which is 36.35% of men above 17 years of age. Digambar Jains have the lowest percentage which is 27.01. Other Christians also have the highest percentage of un-married females with 25.16% and Digambar Jains have the lowest at 14.14%.

Among the Divorced women, Digambar Jains have the highest percentage at 0.58 and the lowest is among Buddhists at 0.10% and Muslims account for 0.52%. Widows/widowers constitute 5.73% of the minority population. Of them 10.24% were widows and 1.58% widowers.

49.96% of the minorities are in rural areas. Digambar Jains have the highest rural population at 76.11% and Swethambar jains have the lowest rural population at 13.43.

Buddhists and Muslims have the highest rate of illiteracy among minorities which is 48% and 47% respectively. Parsees have the lowest rate of illiteracy with 19% followed by 21% among Swethambar Jains. Other Christians account for 22%

Muslims have the lowest level of education after 7th standard and Christians have the highest.

Overall literacy level of minorities in the state is 56 percent. 37.67 percent are educated up to 7th standard and only 18.33% percent are educated above 7th standard.

The level of literacy among minorities in Bangalore Urban, Bangalore Rural, Chitradurga, Chickmagalur, Dakshina Kannada, Hassan, Kodagu, Mandya, Mysore, Shimoga, Tumkur and Uttara Kannada districts was more than the State average. Dakshina Kannada has the highest literacy rate of 74.07% and Raichur district has the lowest which is 38.23%.

Age group wise analysis of children belonging to minorities who are attending schools indicates 36.42% in the age group 6-10 years, 38.46% in the age group 11-13 years and 26.28% in the age group 14-16 years, which shows that over 60 percent of population in the age group 6-16 years is not attending schools.

76 percent of Muslims, 75 percent of SC converted Christians, 65 percent of Digambar Jains and 62 percent of Swethambar Jains in the age group 14-16 years were not attending schools. It was noted that No. of Other Christians attending Schools was highest in age groups namely 6-10 years, 11-13 years and 14-16 years among all Minorities.

The overall percentage of un-employment among the minorities was 10. It was as high as 19 percent among SC converted Christians.

Average annual income of 52 Percent of the minority households was less than Rs.6000. The percentage of households having annual income from Rs.6001-10000 was 15 and households with annual income of over Rs.10000 were 33 percent.

The percentage of the Muslim households with less than Rs.6000 annual income was highest at 64.67% in Bidar district, followed by Bijapur district where the percentage of such households was 63.87%.

Percentage of Muslim households with Rs.10001 and above annual income was highest in Bangalore urban district (47.15), followed by Dakshina Kannada district where the

percentage of such households was 45.78. Among the remaining districts except in the Districts of Kodagu, Mysore and Uttara Kannada less than 30 percent of the households reported income less than Rs. 10,000 per annum.

Gulbarga district had the highest percentage (65.17) of SC converted Christians households with income below Rs.6000 per annum.

Bangalore rural district had the highest percentage (64.66%) of Other Christians with income below Rs.6000 per annum.

Uttara Kannada district had the highest percentage (66.61%) of Digambar Jains with income below Rs.6000 per annum.

Kodagu district had the highest percentage (42.86) of Swethambar Jains with below Rs.6000 annual income.

Representation of minorities in public service was 1.61 percent of their population. The percentage of Muslims and Swethambar Jains in public service was less than the over all average for all minority communities

Representation of minorities in defence services was only 0.08 percent.

98,194 Persons or 1.65 percent of the Minorities population was working as beedi workers and 94 percent of them were muslims.

Minorities have 6 doctors for every 10,000 of their population. While there were 12 doctors for a population of 10,000 among Other Christians, only 5 doctors were there for a population of 10,000 among Muslims.

There were 5 engineers in a population of 10,000 among minorities. While there were 17 engineers in a population of 10,000 among Other Christians, there were only 4 engineers in a population of 10,000 among Muslims.

Only 0.3 percent of the minorities were engaged in whole sale business. 4 percent of Swethambar Jains were engaged in whole sale business.

1.4 percent of the minorities were engaged in retail business. While the percentage of Swethambar Jains in retail business was 7, the percentage of Muslims in this business was 1.5 and that of Christians was far less.

0.3% of the minorities were engaged in street vending.

Among the different sources from which loans were availed by the minorities, money lenders advanced loans to 3.55% of minority households and the banks advanced loans to 7.64% of minority households.

4.52 percent of the total cultivators in the state as per 1991 census were from among the minorities.

36.53 percent Muslim households, 36.86 percent of the SC Converted Christian, 26.38 percent of the Other Christian, 27.50

percent of the Digambar Jain and 9.83 percent of the Swethambar Jain households did not have electricity in their houses.

66.22 percent of the Muslim, 61.66 percent of the SC Converted Christian, 45.32 percent of Other Christian, 72.67 percent of Digambar Jain and 21.66 percent of the Swethambar Jain households did not have toilets in their houses.

38.55 Percent of the Muslim, 44.09 percent of the SC Converted Christian, 34.53 percent of Other Christian, 30.91 percent of the Digambar Jain and 11.22 percent of Swethambar Jain households did not have bathing facility in their houses.

Drinking water facility in their houses was not available to 38.94 percent of Muslim, 41.75 percent of SC Converted Christians, 29.86 percent of Other Christian, 35.60 percent of Digambar Jain and 17.05 percent of Swethambar Jain households.

More than 2/3rd of the minority households did not have sewerage connection to their houses.

Fire wood as a fuel was used by 65 percent of the minority households.

3.7 percent of the owners of the houses had obtained benefit under Ashraya.

10.4 Percent of the widows were beneficiaries under widow pension scheme.

10.08 percent of the minority population entitled to vote was not enrolled as voters.

Only 74.89 percent of the minority households had ration cards.








52 percent of the minority households were eligible to hold green cards. Of these less than 50 percent were provided with green cards.

Among the minorities for every 10,000 persons, 3.02 persons were blind, 2.6 persons were deaf and dumb, 2.40 person were polio affected, 4.70 persons were mentally retarded, 2.90 persons cancer patients, 3.90 persons were affected by T.B and 2.60 persons were affected by leprosy.

22.42 percent of the urban households live in slums. Majority of slum dwellers were Muslims.

The number of households of various communities as a percentage of total households of respective communities who were members of various Co-operative Societies were as follows; Digambar Jains 35.92, Parsees 16.58, Other Christians 11.08, Budhists 9.99, Sikhs 7.81, Swethambar Jains 7.41, Muslims 6.40 and SC Converted Christians 6.01.

INTERIM REPORT OF THE HIGH POWER COMMITTEE

The Socio-Economic and Educational survey of minorities in Karnataka taken up by the Government has been nearly completed. The State Minorities Commission, to which the survey work was entrusted, has enumerated 10.5 lakhs families. The family schedule was drafted by a panel which had Sociologists, Economists, and Planners as Members. The Government machinery and a large number of voluntary agencies were involved in the survey work. No other State in the Country has so far taken up the complete survey of its minorities. One or two States did take up the survey work, but it was only a sample survey and not a complete survey. The State of Karnataka is the first State in the entire Country which decided to take up this onerous task and accomplish it. The questions for the family schedule were so framed that the replies thereto fully revealed the Socio-Economic and Educational level of each family. The data collected is so processed and tables are so generated that the position of each religious minority living in each block, each village/town/ward of a city is fully reflected therein. This is done with the intention of primarily making the Government identify the areas of weakness and the areas of strength of these minorities and enable it to prepare a comprehensive macro-level and micro-level plan for their over all development. It also aims at making the minorities themselves conscious of the deficiencies they suffer from, and to ensure their own fullest participation in the developmental process.

The Government thought it expedient to constitute a High Power Committee to have the data collected in the survey processed in a manner which should give a complete analysis of the position of minorities in various areas and then prepare the comprehensive plan for their over all development. It, therefore, decided to make use of the services of very senior officers who have been involved in the process of Planning and Implementation of Developmental Programmes of the Government to work with the representatives of the people who are associated with the development of Minorities. The Government therefore constituted the High Power Committee, which is as follows:

The data processed so far shows that illiteracy rate among the minorities is as high as 44%. The dropout rate is significant, particularly at the initial stages of learning. For instance, at the lower Primary level the drop out rate is 31% at the Higher Primary level it is 46%, High school level 60%, at the PUC 80%. Those who complete graduation in any discipline are in a negligible number. This only shows that to improve the educational level among the minorities, efforts are to be made right from the pre-primary level.

The survey reveals that nearly 50% of the minorities population in Karnataka lives below the poverty line. Low accessibility of minorities to the income earning opportunities is the main reason for their poverty. Sources of earning can be broadly classified into three groups viz:

- i. Land based occupation;
- ii. Industry & business; and
- iii. Service.

Although, agriculture is a very remunerative economic activity, unfortunately minorities have not been benefiting from it because they have very little access to land resources. Big land holders are in a very small number among minorities. They are mostly small and marginal farmers.

Answers to certain questions have revealed that the trend of out migration has set in among the minorities during the last few years. They are migrating from rural areas to urban areas constantly in search of employment. The increasing number of urban slums with concentration of minorities is the result of this out-migration.

The share of minorities in medium and large industries is particularly nil with the exception of a negligible number owned by the jains. In the small scale industries also their participation is almost negligible. Same is the case with big business houses.

The data collected shows that in retail trade in the informal sector activity, the participation of minorities is there to some extent. The survey makes it very clear that the minorities have not benefited to a significant extent from the on-going developmental Programmes of the Government like IRDP, JRY, NRY, TRYSEM, etc.. This can be attributed partly to the low level of awareness among the minorities and partly to indifference from authorities concerned.

The percentage of minorities in the service of the Government and in public sector undertakings is extremely low. The statistics collected reveal that not even 2% are in Government service. The data processed shows that more than 33% of the eligible youths among the minorities are unemployed. Those who are under employed, constitute a very large majority. The survey reveals that approximately 14 lakhs are unemployed among the minorities in the State. Out of the 20 lakhs employed, 60% percent are under-employed.

This Committee has examined the position in various sectors in great detail, and makes the following interim recommendations which can be considered for immediate implementation. After the processing of data is complete for the entire State, the Committee will submit a micro-level planning in its final report.

EDUCATION:

1. Since, a decision has been taken to ensure primary education for children in their mother tongue, the Government have to take a decision either to start adequate number of Government Primary Schools with the mother tongue of the minorities as the medium of instruction or to permit the voluntary organisations to start schools, to cater to the needs of minorities, if they come forward to do so.

2. The data collected has shown that drop-out rate is high at the Primary level. In fact, the figures show that a very large number of primary schools in minority languages are only up to lower primary level. There are no facilities for continuing education from fifth standard onwards. It is, therefore, essential that facilities be provided for continuing education to the minorities. A decision may, therefore, be taken to upgrade all primary schools started for religious and linguistic minorities to that of Higher Primary level. This could be done @ 500 Schools each year, starting from the current year.

3. Government have taken a decision to start 224 High Schools. It is recommended that this number be raised to 300 and 76 High Schools be earmarked to cater to the needs of minorities. It is also to be ensured that once it is decided to either start Government Schools or to allow voluntary agencies to start such schools, the Department of Public Instruction should process things expeditiously. This could be done @ 25 Schools each year from the current year itself. However, since 10 Urdu High Schools have already been sanctioned during the current year, 15 more could be sanctioned in Talukas where there are three or more Higher Primary Schools belonging to the linguistic minority.

4. Vocational courses are to be liberally granted for minority institutions. The Director of Vocational Education may be instructed to grant two vocational courses at least to one institution run by the minorities in each District, in addition to the already existing vocational institutions.

5. The number of Professional institutions started by minorities is inadequate. When permissions were being granted liberally for starting Professional Institutions, minorities were not in a position to start such institutions. Now, when they have become conscious of their educational needs and have reached a stage where they could start Professional educational institutions, and are coming forward to start such institutions, the Government took a decision to impose a moratorium on starting of new professional institutions. It is, therefore, suggested that this moratorium should not be applied to minorities. It is relevant to mention here that any ban to start Professional Institution by Minorities is violative of Article 30(1) of the Constitution.

6. It may be decided that all cases for issue of minority status certificate to the educational institutions started by minorities, will be cleared wherever they satisfy the academic norms laid down, within two weeks. Simultaneously, within these two weeks, a final decision could also be taken in respect of cases of minority institutions which are pending either for permission to start, grant of recognition, or for admission to Grant-in-aid, in case they have completed the period that was stipulated at the time of starting of these institutions.

7. Since minorities cannot run educational institutions on their own for an in-definite period, it is necessary that the present procedure of obtaining an undertaking that the management will never claim Grant-in-aid at the time of receipt of application for starting institutions, shall be dispensed-with in the case of minorities.

8. Wherever minority run Post-matric Educational Institutions are not there in any District, permission may be granted automatically to the voluntary organisations to start Junior Colleges or Degree Colleges, subject to their satisfying academic standards.

9. The Directorate for Urdu & Other Minority Languages, may be restructured and redesignated as Directorate of Minorities, with powers of sanction of schools and to deal with all minorities educational matters.

10. The policy of the Central Government is to encourage setting up of Residential Schools. It is particularly necessary for the minorities to have residential schools. The Minorities have conglomeration of linguistic problems and to cater to their requirements, it is necessary to start residential schools. Such residential schools should have an all India character. For this purpose, the Government will have to issue 'No Objection Certificate' for starting Residential Schools in the State under CBSE/ICSE to HRD Ministry, Government of India, by the Minorities. It is, therefore, requested that the Government permit starting of at least 10 residential schools by minorities in Karnataka under Central Government CBSE/ICSE Schemes and to issue necessary 'No Objection Certificate' for that purpose. It would enable the minorities in Karnataka to draw financial assistance from Moulana Azad Educational Trust, which has been started by Central Government for promoting Education among the minorities by establishing residential schools.

11. A policy decision is to be taken that the minorities, whose mother tongue is not Kannada, will be eligible for Grant-in-aid from the very first year, in case they start Kannada medium schools, wherein the strength of such minorities is not less than 30%.

12. The Minority Educational Institutions are finding it difficult to acquire land for their Educational Institutions. Hence, they may be permitted to acquire agricultural land, get it converted and use for Educational purposes.

13. The Minorities students need hostel facilities. Though, as backwards class they are entitled to admission in backward class hostels, the Survey reveals that only a few students get admission in these hostels. The Government has a separate scheme under the Directorate of Backward Classes and Minorities to give grants to minorities organisations, who come forward to establish hostels. The pace of establishment of such hostels by the BCM

Directorate is very slow. It is suggested that the Government should permit starting of 20 minorities hostels under the scheme and provide grants to them, in addition to the existing hostel. The present capital grant is Rs. one lakh for such hostels. It is suggested that the grant be raised to Rs. three lakhs.

ECONOMIC UPLIFTMENT:

1. The Survey has revealed that the minorities are facing acute Economic Problems. The possibilities of their engaging themselves in agriculture or as agricultural laborers are ruled out, as they have all migrated to Urban areas. 60% of the minorities population is concentrated in Urban areas and 34% is in rural areas. Majority of the urban minorities population is engaged as laborers, manufacturers, Retail traders and vendors, unskilled workers, Drivers etc., Even in Government jobs, a large number of them are in Group 'D' category. The survey further reveals that a large number of minorities find it difficult to get employment either in Government service or in Public or Private Sector. The only course left for them is self employment. To get themselves self employed in various vocations and professions, they need financial assistance. Unfortunately, the Banks are not coming forward to cater to the needs of minorities. Efforts should continue to persuade Banks to provide more credit to minorities. At the same time, an alternate form of credit which would ensure easy flow of credit is essential. It is, therefore, necessary that the minorities should be encouraged to form Urban Multipurpose Credit Co-operative Societies in urban centers, and through such societies help themselves to get credit for the purposes of self employment or for engaging themselves in gainful employment. It is, therefore, suggested that at least 50 to 60 Urban Co-operative Multi Purpose Credit Societies to be established with an Apex Institution to monitor, help and assist in establishing such societies. Out of such societies established, a few of them can be set apart for women. This effort will supplement the existing flow of credit to minorities from Karnataka State Minorities Development Corporation and Banks.

2. Kannada is Official and administrative language of the State. Kannada is not the mother tongue of 90% of the Religious minorities in the State. The Minorities whose mother tongue is other than Kannada are put to lot of dis-advantage in getting

jobs in the Government service. To overcome this, it is very essential to promote learning of Kannada among the minorities whose mother tongue is other than Kannada. At present, a person who wants to enter Government Service has to pass a Departmental Kannada Test, and each Department conducts its own Test. To overcome this, it is suggested that the government should recognise Kannada diploma courses of Bangalore University and other Universities in the State and also to ask the KSEB (Karnataka Secondary Education Board) to start a certificate course in Kannada and conduct examination. Further, the Government should exempt all those persons, who have passed the Certificate course or Diploma course from Kannada Departmental test. Further, Minority voluntary Educational Institutions should be permitted to conduct classes for diploma in Kannada courses for the benefit of those who want to enter Government service, after getting recognition from the University or from KSEB. The Committee suggests that the Government should provide grants to such Organisations of Minorities, which come forward to establish such Kannada institutes from Department of Kannada and Culture.

3. A trend has set in, wherein minorities are migrating from rural areas to urban areas and a large number of urban slums are coming up. Minorities in these slums are living in miserable conditions. It is, therefore, necessary that the Slum Clearance Board be asked to utilise at least 25% of its funds for various development purposes in such slums where there is concentration of minorities.

4. The benefits from programs like PMRY, JRY, IRDP, NREP etc., have not reached the minorities in adequate measure. It would, therefore, be better if the implementing authorities are instructed to select clusters where there is a concentration of minority population. It would also be necessary that the Banks/Financial Institutions be strictly instructed not to insist upon security from the beneficiaries for sanction of loan under these programmes, because it is not stipulated in the scheme itself.

5. To check out migration of minorities from rural areas to urban areas, it would be better if they are granted 2 hectares of agricultural land under the Land Grant Rules at the rate of 100 families per Taluka. This would indirectly bring down the speed with which the urban slums are increasing.

6. There are many Artisans and Technicians from among the minorities who do not have their own units and work for others. It would, therefore, be better if in the Industrial Estates common work sheds are provided to minorities, wherein they could under take the lathe work, welding etc., by paying nominal charges.

7. Awareness camps be organised at each district headquarters and at taluka headquarters, where there is concentration of minority population. In these programmes minorities shall be made aware of the various on-going developmental programmes of the Government. The Bankers and the representatives of other financial institutions could also be invited for these programmes to make the minorities aware of various programmes for which loans are available.

8. Entrepreneurship development programmes-cum-credit camps could be organised exclusively for minorities. Every year, a minimum of four such camps in Bangalore District, two each in Districts of Bidar, Gulbarga, Bijapur, Dharwad, Belgaum and Mysore and one each in the rest of the districts should be organised by the Department of Industries & Commerce. On the last day of the training programme, the Lead Bank Managers along with other Bankers should be invited and the trainees should be linked with Banks for financial assistance. The District Industries Centre should thereafter take the follow-up action by guiding the entrepreneurs and closely monitoring the progress achieved by them as per the targets fixed.

9. One of the Joint Directors in the Directorate of Industries & Commerce shall be nominated as Nodal Officer, who would plan and monitor the development of entrepreneurship among the minorities.

10. A vast net-work of Co-operatives for minorities be established. Intensive efforts be also made to involve minorities as members of the existing Co-operatives.

11. One of the Joint Registrars in the Office of the Registrar of Co-operative Societies shall be nominated to plan and monitor the work of organising Co-operatives for the minorities, determining the type of Society to be organised, keeping in view

the need of the area and the interest of minorities living in that area.

12. Hand loom artisans should be provided with improved looms under Vishwa/Bank Loans.

13. The survey reveals that a sizable number of persons belonging to minorities are automobile mechanics working for others on wages. It will be better if roadside cabins are provided to them on Highways and at important places in the Cities on the lines LIDKAR has done.

This High Power Committee strongly urges the Govt. to accept recommendations made and issue necessary Government Orders thereon to coincide with the Birth anniversary of Shri D.Devaraj Urs, which falls on 20th of August 1994.

SCHEMES LAUNCHED ON THE EVE OF 79TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF LATE SRI. D.DEVARAJ URS.

1. UP-GRADATION OF URDU LOWER PRIMARY SCHOOLS:

It is decided to up grade 1000 Medium lower primary schools. Every year, from next academic year 500 institutions will be upgraded depending upon the places.

2. OPENING OF URDU MEDIUM HIGH SCHOOLS:

In such of those taluks where the population of Minorities in the total population exceeds 15% or where there are more than 3 Higher Primary (Urdu Medium) schools, Government have decided to open a Government High School or to assist a voluntary organisation to open a Urdu Medium High School. About 75 High School will be opened in a phased manner in a period of 2 or 3 years.

3. STARTING OF PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS:

At least one Minority Education Institution in every District will be upgraded to 10 + 2 classes and professional courses commenced. 20 students will be admitted in these courses in a year.

4. OPENING OF MINORITIES COLLEGES:

With a view to encourage starting of Minorities Educational Institutions, it is decided to permit the Voluntary Organisations to start Minorities Colleges.

5. MINORITIES PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS:

Government of India has launched a programme of start-

ing of Moulana Azad Residential Schools for Minorities. Similarly voluntary organisations will be permitted to start such Residential Schools. For this purpose an amount of Rs. 50 Crores is provided for the entire Country. With a view to obtain atleast Rs. 5 Crores out of this amount Government of Karnataka have decided to prescribe CBSE (Syllabus) programme and permit to start one Residential School in each of the 10 Districts. Such schools will begin to function initially from 5th Std. For Starting these schools, NOC will be issued by the Education Department.

6. DISPOSAL OF PENDING CASES RELATED TO MINORITIES INSTITUTIONS:

There will be many grievences in Minority Education Institutions such as - According a status of Minority Education to Minorities Institutions, Recognition, Sanction of posts etc. In order to settle these grievences in 2 weeks, "Clearance Drive" will be launched.

7. STARTING OF MINORITIES CO-OPERATIVE FEDERATION:

With a view to help Minorities in Self Employment, 60 City Co-operative Societies and Credit Co-operative Societies shall provide loan facility. These Co-operative Societies will have Nodal Apex Agencies at the State level. This Agency shall be similar to a Federation.

8. RESERVATION OF INDUSTRIAL SHEDS TO MINORITIES:

Some of the Industrial sheds, constructed by Karnataka State Small Scale Industries Development Corporation should be reserved for Minorities. In Order to ensure fullfledged establishment of an Industry in these sheds, they will be handed over to the Karnataka Minorities Development Corporation.

PREAMBLE :

In Notification No. DPAR 11 LMR 91 dated 20th January, 1993, the State Minorities Commission has been constituted to safeguard the interest of Minorities.

2. The question of indicating the terms of reference of the State Minorities Commission has been examined by the Government.

GOVERNMENT ORDER No : DPAR 4 LMR 93,

BANGALORE, DATED 6TH FEBRUARY 1993.

Government are pleased to indicate the following terms of reference of the State Minorities Commission.

TERMS OF REFERENCE—

- (1) To evaluate the working of the various safeguards provided in the Constitution and in the laws passed by the Legislature for the protection of Minorities.
- (2) To make recommendations with a view to ensuring effective implementation and enforcement of all the safeguards.
- (3) To undertake a review of the implementation of the policies and schemes of the State Government with respect to Minorities.
- (4) To conduct studies, research and analysis on the question of avoidance of discrimination against Minorities.
- (5) To conduct socio-economic and educational survey of the Minorities and suggest to the State Government measures for their economic upliftment and educational advancement.
- (6) To make a factual assessment of the representation of Minorities in the services of the State, Government Undertakings, Government and Quasi Government bodies etc., and in case representation is inadequate, to suggest ways and means to achieve the desired level.
- (7) To closely monitor the implementation of the Fifteen Point Programme for the welfare of Minorities, keep the Government informed of its impact on the target groups and suggest ways and means for its effective implementation.
- (8) To study the working of the instructions issued by the Reserve Bank of India to facilitate the flow of credit to Minorities and suggest measures to ensure smoother flow of credit to them.

- (9) To study and other matter which, in the opinion of the Commission is important from the point of view of the welfare and development of Minorities and to make appropriate recommendation.
- (10) To consider the grievances of the Minorities and to suggest appropriate solution from time to time.
- (11) To suggest measures to combat the growth of communalism, promote communal harmony and to ensure protection of life, honour and property of Minorities.
- (12) To make a study of the condition of Government run Minority language Institutions in the State in terms of building, equipment, adequacy of teaching staff, timely supply of Text Books, Educational standard etc. and make necessary recommendations for improving the same, wherever necessary.
- (13) To suggest measures to safeguard and protect the interest of Minority languages without prejudice to the interests of regional language viz, Kannada.
- (14) To make periodical reports to the State Government at prescribed intervals.

: P R E A M B L E :

In Government Order read at (1) above, the Karnataka State Minorities Commission has been constituted, and in the Government Order read at (2) above the terms of reference of the Commission have been indicated. One of the terms of reference to the Commission is to conduct the socio-economic and educational survey of Minorities in the State and to suggest to the State Government measures for their economic upliftment and educational advancement. This survey has to be completed within three months time. It is estimated that in Karnataka there are a little more than a million families belonging to the religious minorities viz., Muslims, Christians, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis and Sikhs.

The State Minorities Commission will get the household interview schedules printed and supplied to the districts. The Karnataka State Minorities Commission has estimated that 7,137 enumerators and 1,635 supervisors will be required for this survey. The Deputy Commissioner of districts will get this survey conducted with the assistance of the employees of the Departments of Revenue, Backward Classes and Minorities, Public Instruction, Development, Economics and Statistics and such other departments as is considered necessary.

The State Minorities Commission has requested the Government to assign specific roles to Government officers

for the survey work. Hence the following orders-

Government are pleased to direct that various departments of Government shall extend all co-operation and assistance to the State Minorities Commission in conducting the Socio-economic and Educational survey of Minorities in the State.

The District Officers for Backward Classes and Minorities and District Statistical Officers will be the Additional Survey Commissioners. While, the Deputy Commissioners would be in over all charge of the survey work in the district, the District Officers for Backward Classes and Minorities will be responsible for co-ordination of the survey work, convening of meetings, arranging of training programmes, supply of schedules and collection of filled in schedules etc., He would also liaison between the Survey Commissioner and the State Minorities Commission. He would supervise the field work and scrutinise at random the filled in schedules.

The Tashildars will be Taluk Level Survey Officers. They would appoint enumerators from among the school teachers and the supervisors from the departments of Public Instruction, Revenue, Development etc., They would also form the blocks in the Taluks with the assistance of the staff from the Department of Economics and Statistics.

The State Minorities Commission will draw the calendar of events.

Government have decided to have the Socio-economic and Educational Survey of the Minorities, conducted by the State Minorities Commission with assistance from the various Departments. The total number of families belonging to ~~xxxx~~ religious Minorities viz., Muslims, Christians, Jains, Parsees, Buddhists, Sikhs is estimated to be a little more than a million in the State of Karnataka and the Survey has to cover each one of these families.

Orders of the Government have been separately issued, assigning specific roles to the Deputy Commissioners and other Officers for conducting the survey in the rural areas. It is felt expedient now to assign specific roles to the officers working in the Department of Urban Development for conducting the survey in Urban areas. Hence the following order.

The Commissioners of the City Corporations are designated as City Corporation Survey Commissioners. They will be in overall charge of the survey in respect of the City Corporation areas. They will appoint enumerators from among the school teachers and supervisors from the Government Department inclusive of the Corporation staff. They would also form the enumerators blocks in the corporation areas for the purpose of the survey. They may, if so desire,

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nominate a responsible officer of the Corporation to look after the survey work and the officer so nominated would also attend the training programmes at the State level.

The State Minorities Commission will draw the calendar of events, it will also supply household interview schedules in adequate number to the commissioners of the City Corporations along with the house list schedules and the students survey schedules.

The District Officers for Backward Classes and Minorities will be responsible for co-ordination of the survey work, convening of meetings, arranging of training programmes, supply of schedules and collection of filled in schedules etc., They will also liaison between the City Corporation Survey Commissioner and the State Minorities Commission. The District Statistical Officers will be responsible for organising training programmes in consultation with the City Corporation Survey Commissioners, and will also participate in the taluk level training programmes. They will supervise the field work and scrutinise at random the filled in schedules.

The Advisory Committee to be constituted by the State Minorities Commission under the Chairmanship of the Commissioners for the City Corporation, will oversee survey work and will ensure that the support of the Voluntary Organisations is also made available for conducting the survey work and also in identifying the minority families in their areas of operations.

The Commissioners of City Municipal Councils and the Chief Officers of Town Municipalities, Notified areas and Sanitary Boards will also work as Survey Officers in their respective areas under the control of the Deputy Commissioners. They will be responsible for formation

of enumerators' blocks, appoint of enumerators from among the school teachers and supervisors from the staff of various departments posted in their areas. They will also organise training programmes in consultation with the District Statistical Officers concerned.

While the Commissioners of the City Municipal Councils would attend the training programme at the State level, the Chief Officers would attend the training programmes at the District level.
